To weather it all, we must remind ourselves—and each other—that we are companioned by a Lord who will not leave or forsake us. Yes, we put our trust in the crucified and risen One, who will accompany us come hell or highwater, all the way through the alley!

Not a hope based on optimism in human abilities or achievements, but a hope invested in him whom death itself could not hold captive.
